I agree to Adopt-A-Spot for the following 2 year duration:

First-time applicants must meet with the Parks & Recreation Department to discuss their plans for the spot and the level of maintenance they are willing to provide. A drawing of the area should be provided with a list of drought resistant plants that will be added. Depending on the site location, the flora should be low-lying, so as to not block any vehicle views. The adoptee will be responsible for maintaining the spot for a minimum of 2 years or longer if desired, or until the Parks & Recreation Department deems the area is not being maintained to Park standards.

Any mulched areas need to be weeded on a regular basis.

You are hereby recognized as a volunteer of the Town of Hampton, a municipal corporation duly organized under the laws of the State of New Hampshire. Your tenure as a volunteer will continue until your resignation, your termination by the Town of Hampton or as provided in this Agreement. The purpose of this clause is to comply with the provisions of RSA 508:17; the volunteer Immunity law, as the law may be amended from time to time.
