BLASTING PERMIT APPLICATION

Application is hereby made to obtain a permit for blasting operations in the Town of Hampton, New Hampshire. All operations shall be done to current Federal, State (SAF-C 1600) and local (NFPA 495 Explosive Materials Code) regulations and standards. No blasting operations shall begin until a permit is secured from the Bureau of Fire Prevention. **The permit must be secured 24 hours prior to work.** The following items shall accompany this application:

- Certificate of Liability Insurance allowing work in Hampton, N.H.
- A legible copy of operators blasting license and current drivers license
- A list showing maximum amount and type of explosives & detonators that will be on site (on back of application or attached)
- Scaled distance or vibration instrumentation (circle one)
