

Video Display Devices



By State Statute (RSA 149-M: 27) Video Display Devices cannot be disposed of in the trash. "Video display media recorder/player" means an electronic component capable of playing and/or recording analog or digital video signal on or from various types of media, including magnetic tape, optically scanned disks, integral hard drives or other types of memory devices. This includes electronic components such as a videocassette recorder (VCR), a digital video disk (VDR) or a component with a digital hard drive.

The following items are considered Video Display Devices. **Please do not throw any of these items in your trash or recycling barrel!**

Devices with a diagonal viewing screen that is less than 4" can be dropped off **FREE** of charge

Devices with a diagonal viewing screen of 4 inches or larger are subject to fees at the Transfer Station depending on the size of the screen. Fee schedule is as follows:

4" – 8" screen	\$5.00
9" – 21"	\$10.00
22" or larger	\$15.00
